Playing Venues

Due to the scale of the event, we now have **TWO** playing venues:

Highfields Sports Complex, University Boulevard, Nottingham, NG7 2PS

This is the main playing venue and location for the following:

- Opening Ceremony on Monday 15 July
- All matches on Monday 15 July
- Matches for the following categories on Tuesday 16 to Thursday 18 July:
 - o Men's Open, Women's Open, Mixed Open
 - o Women's 27s, Men's 30s, Mixed 30s
- All matches on Friday 19, Saturday 20 and Sunday 21 July
- All finals on Saturday 20 and Sunday 21 July

The site is within walking distance from the main University accommodation and easily accessible by public transport via tram and bus from the city and other areas. There will be **NO** organised event transport for this location. There will be a drop-off zone for coaches and parking for cars at Nottingham Hockey Centre located adjacent to the venue (same postcode). There is **NO** Coach Parking on site.

Riverside Sports Complex, Lenton Lane, Nottingham, NG7 2SA

This is the second playing venue and location for the following:

- Matches for the following categories on Tuesday 16 to Thursday 18 July:
 - Men's and Women's 35s
 - Men's and Women's 40s
 - o Men's 45s, Men's 50s and Men's 55s

There will be a coach drop-off point located adjacent to the venue at Power League Football, Thane Road, Nottingham, NG7 2TG. There will also be some car parking at the venue itself. There is **NO** access to the venue to coaches or larger vehicles. There is **NO** Coach Parking on site.

Due to limited public transport to this venue, we will be arranging Event Transport through Skills Coaches with return journeys every morning and afternoon/evening on 16th, 17th and 18th July between the following locations.







- Nottingham City Centre and Riverside Sports Complex
- Nottingham University main campus and Riverside Sports Complex

The schedule and timings of these will be confirmed when match fixtures have been finalised.

<u>Player Eligibility and Clearance Processes</u>

The recent Singapore Member Forum determined that player eligibility is the responsibility of the respective National Touch organisation and that FIT will not be undertaking the eligibility checks as it has in the past. Therefore please take notice of the following

- Eligibility: refer to the Eligibility Policy as linked <u>HERE</u> it is important to note that FIT will be conducting
 eligibility audits on receipt of an appeal by an NTO and randomly throughout the event
- Clearance: the Clearance application form linked <u>HERE</u> should be used by players seeking clearance to transfer from one nation to another. Bearing in mind that the eligibility of a player wishing to represent another NTO must meet the requirements as detailed in the Eligibility Policy. Obtaining a clearance will not determine eligibility.

Each player on registration will agree that they are eligible to compete for the respective NTO and Division. Should a player be found to be ineligible for an NTO at the event, then the potential outcomes for that offence are:

- Player disqualification
- Team disqualification
