

Title: Lead Psychologist

Your role as Lead Psychologist is to support elite Touch players in their preparation for international competition.

Role purpose:

- To lead and manage a team of sport psychologists to ensure a consistent high quality support for elite touch athletes
- Develop a holistic approach, underpinned by evidence-based practice, to support both athletes and coaching staff in their preparation for, and during, international competition
- Liaise with elite coaching staff, Head of Medical Services and Lead Sport Scientist to ensure the ongoing development of England Touch elite athletes.

Experience:

- Experience in leading people in an elite sport environment with proven skills in providing psychological support
- You will have evidence of successfully integrating sport psychology into an established coaching structure
- You will have shown the ability to plan and deliver a flexible approach to working with demanding groups in sport and responding to the changing environment of high performance teams
- Experience working in a multi-disciplinary team.
